

Texans for Medical Marijuana

Texans for Medical Marijuana was a statewide grassroots organization that began in January of 2004 with a mission of changing Texas law to protect medical marijuana patients, who possessed a doctor's recommendation, from arrest and incarceration. The organization ceased operations in May 2007.

Several doctors and individuals endorsed the following statement of principle:

Licensed medical doctors should not be punished for recommending the medical use of marijuana to seriously ill people, and seriously ill people should not be subject to criminal sanctions for using marijuana, if the patient's physician has told the patient that such use is likely to be beneficial.
